ONLY VALID FOR GUESTS ON TOURIST VISA

The rules are different for Diplomats, Returnees, Non Resident Nepalis & Resident Visa Holders



CHECKLIST

1. Book your flight tickets
2. Find out if Entry status is the latest one
3. Call up the Diplomatic Mission or use your agent in Nepal to find out the latest rules
4. Find out how long it takes to get a PCR test result. This could be problematic.

VISA BEFORE ARRIVAL

Apply via a Nepalese Diplomatic Mission in your home country

Present a clear itinerary, flight and initial hotel booking

VISA ON ARRIVAL

Visa On Arrival can only be done via recommendation from your travel agent in Nepal. Contact your agent, who will do the necessary paperwork for it. Takes a few days max. Check back, as conditions keep changing.

BEFORE YOU FLY

- **-ve PCR report (ideally with photo)**
72 hours or less before first flight
- **Get TRAVEL INSURANCE**
covering Medicals & Evacuations
- **BOOK a Hotel**
For the first 7 days (or get your agency to do it)
- **Fill CCMC Online Form**
(and keep confirmation with barcode handy)

AIRLINES WILL CHECK

1. Your visa
2. Travel insurance
3. Negative PCR test report
4. Hotel booking confirmation
5. CCMC form filled confirmation (BarCode)
6. Could deny boarding if everything not there

PROOF OF QUARANTINE STAY

At the end of the 7 day quarantine proof of which should be there in the hotel reservations, one can move within Nepal, provided the area is not under lockdown!
